

**Glen Pettigrove** holds the Chair in Moral Philosophy at the University of Glasgow. His research examines the role that emotions and traits of character play in the moral life. He has written a number of things on the nature and norms of forgiveness, including *Forgiveness and Love* (Oxford University Press, 2012). He has also published a series of articles on anger, guilt, and shame. Some of his work on character focuses on particular traits, such as ambition, meekness, cheerfulness, and grace. Other work – including ‘Re-Conceiving Character,’ and ‘Is Virtue Ethics Self-Effacing?’ – investigates character-based ethical theories more broadly.
