

## **BIOGRAPHY**

**Katherine J. Gold, MD, MSW, MS** is Assistant Professor at the University of Michigan (UM) in the Department of Family Medicine and the Department of Obstetrics & Gynecology. She is board certified in family medicine, holds Masters Degrees in both Social Work and in Health and Health Services Research, and has completed two research training fellowships. She serves on the Board and the Science Advisory Committee of the International Stillbirth Alliance. She completed a fellowship with the National Academy of Medicine. Dr. Gold's research focuses on mental health among perinatally-bereaved populations and she was funded by the National Institutes of Mental Health for the Michigan Mothers Study, a longitudinal investigation of outcomes among perinatally-bereaved mothers. She also researches maternal mental health and stillbirth prevention in sub-Saharan Africa and has published on how health care providers in the U.S. and Ghana cope with perinatal death. Clinically, Dr. Gold serves as a family medicine attending physician delivering low-risk babies and caring for newborns at the University of Michigan and also sees patients in her primary care clinic. Since 2016, she has served as the medical director for a free prenatal and infant care clinic in Detroit serving a high-risk, very low-income population with the goal of reducing stillbirth and infant death.
